Stop Your Windows 7 Automatically Updating To Windows 10

In the view of the writer Windows 7 has the most logical and consistent interface of all of the main operating systems you can run on your computer. There's no space here to tell you why I don't like Windows 8 or Windows 10. Suffice to say that at the Northcliffe CRC we run Windows 7 and will continue to do so for some time to come.

Microsoft is pushing very hard to force Windows 7 users to update to Windows 10 and, unfortunately, their tactics are getting increasingly aggressive and underhanded.

Windows 10 has been reclassified by Microsoft as a 'Recommended Update' which means that if your settings are 'Install Recommended Updates Automatically' then you could

be updated to Windows 10 **against your wishes**. Some users report waking up one day to find their computer running Windows 10. A nightmare you can't wake from!

We recommend you leave Windows updates turned on, however install a software tool called GWX Panel to stop noxious Windows 10 adverts and updates. Downloaded this free software:

"Download Installer" is the first link on the top right. Install and click the various options. This free software attempts to block the upgrade attempts. While there is no guarantee Microsoft won't find its way around this, it works—for now.
