



The Funding Flows

I'm sure most of you have already heard the big news: the State Government has restored the missing \$5m per annum to the annual budget for CRCs. CRC funding will remain at \$13m per annum. The majority of this money is cut up and divided amongst 105 CRCs. The government has also announced its support for keeping the CRC trainee program running and an extension to NCRC's current services contract to June 2020 (an extra 15 months).

CRCs now appear to having the support of the Nationals, the Labor and Liberal party, and the Greens. This is possibly the broadest political support CRCs have ever enjoyed and the future looks rosy.

Our thanks Minister Allanah MacTiernan, to the Government and to everyone in the community, the CRC network, and the political sphere who assisted our lobbying to achieve this result. Linkwest, our peak body, also deserves plenty of credit.

We would like to offer our sincere thanks to Northcliffians who helped us create customer testimonial videos, who wrote letters and postcards and signed petitions on our behalf. Thanks are also due to Terry Redman MLA and the Nationals, to Greens MLC Diane Evers and to Labour MLC Adele Farina. Thanks to Pingelly CRC Manager and Linkwest President Lee Steele, who was eloquent and passionate in our defence, arranging press conferences, radio interviews and other lobbying efforts.

Amongst many other CRCs in the network, Northcliffe CRC were proud of our own lobbying efforts to achieve this result.

A quick happy dance and then back to work. We have lots of deadlines and funding requirements to meet as usual. There is not a lot of time for contemplating our 'brush with death'.
